

# Prostate Cancer

Awareness can save your life



1 in 6 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer before the age of 85 and more than 3,000 lose their battle every year.

Cancer doesn't discriminate, so at any age it's important to be aware of any unusual changes. These include:



- Frequent urination
- Urgent and sudden need to urinate
- Difficulty in urinating
- Weaker than normal stream
- Painful ejaculation
- Blood in urine or semen
- Erectile dysfunction

Males over the age of 50 should discuss prostate cancer with their doctor and be screened for the disease on an annual basis. This can be done through a simple PSA blood test, which checks for elevated levels of prostate specific antigen (a protein produced by both cancerous and non- cancerous tissue in the prostate).
